The organisation was founded in 1981 by a group of teachers, youth workers and canal enthusiasts who recognised the benefit of introducing children and young people, particularly from the inner cities, to the enjoyment of canals and inland waterways.

Today we continue to welcome a wide variety of community groups and organisations of all ages and backgrounds from all over the UK and

overseas to enjoy the experience of canal boating from our two full-size canal boats, Lancelot and Guinevere.

They are based at the historic junction of the Grand Union and the Oxford Canal at Braunston, a pretty historic village located five miles from Daventry in Northamptonshire and eight miles from Rugby in Warwickshire.
